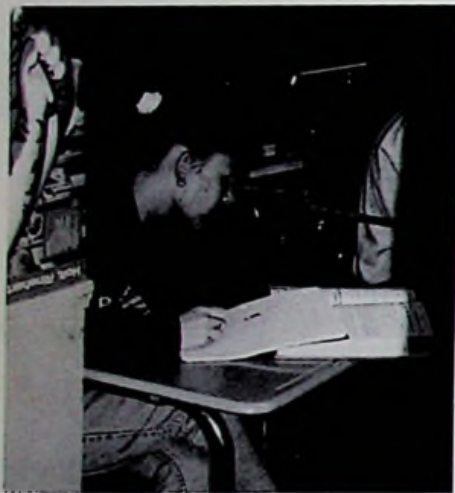

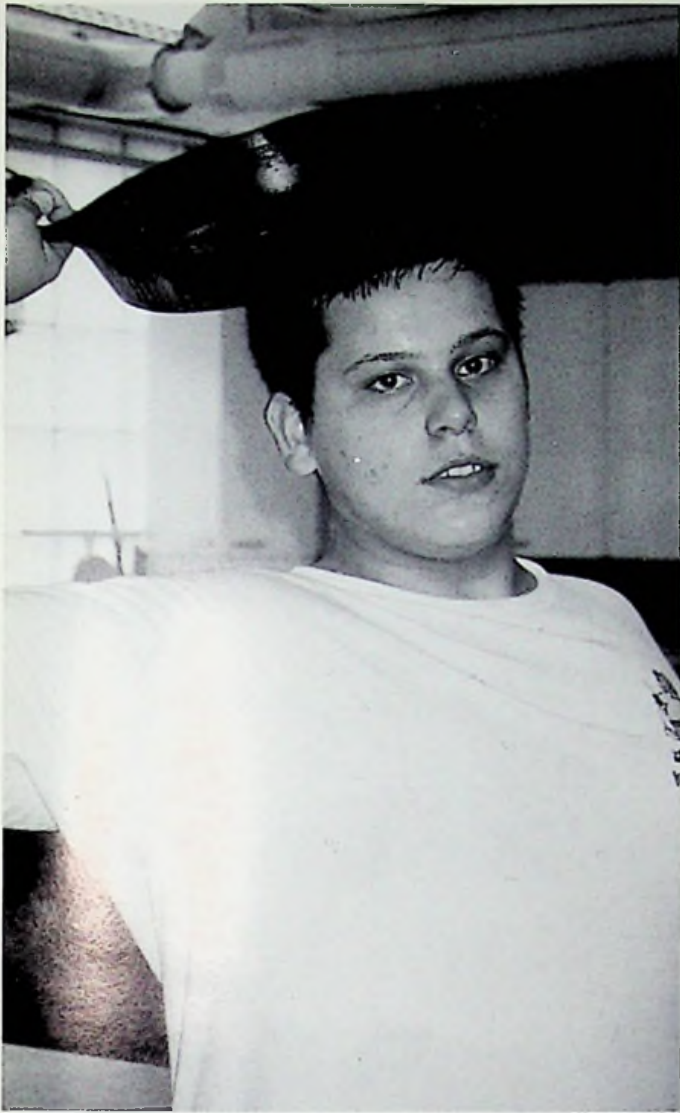

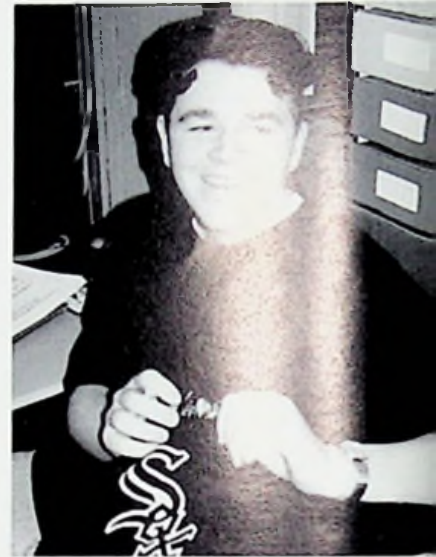

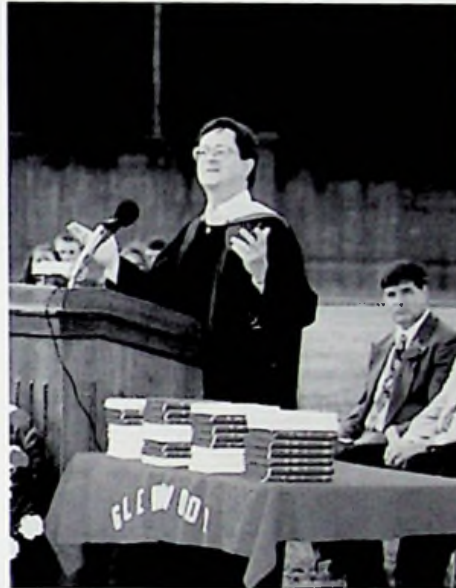

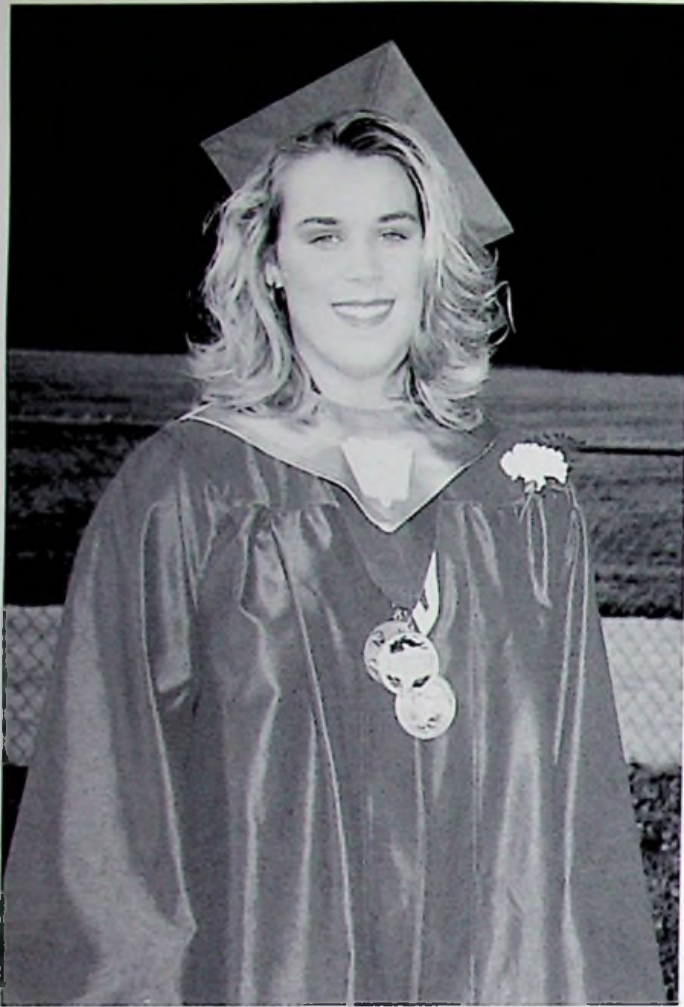

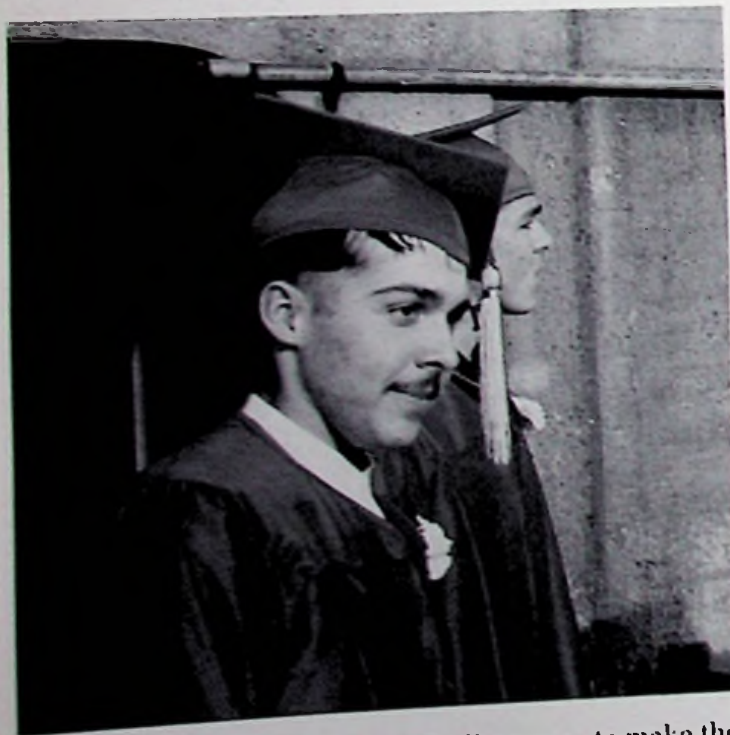

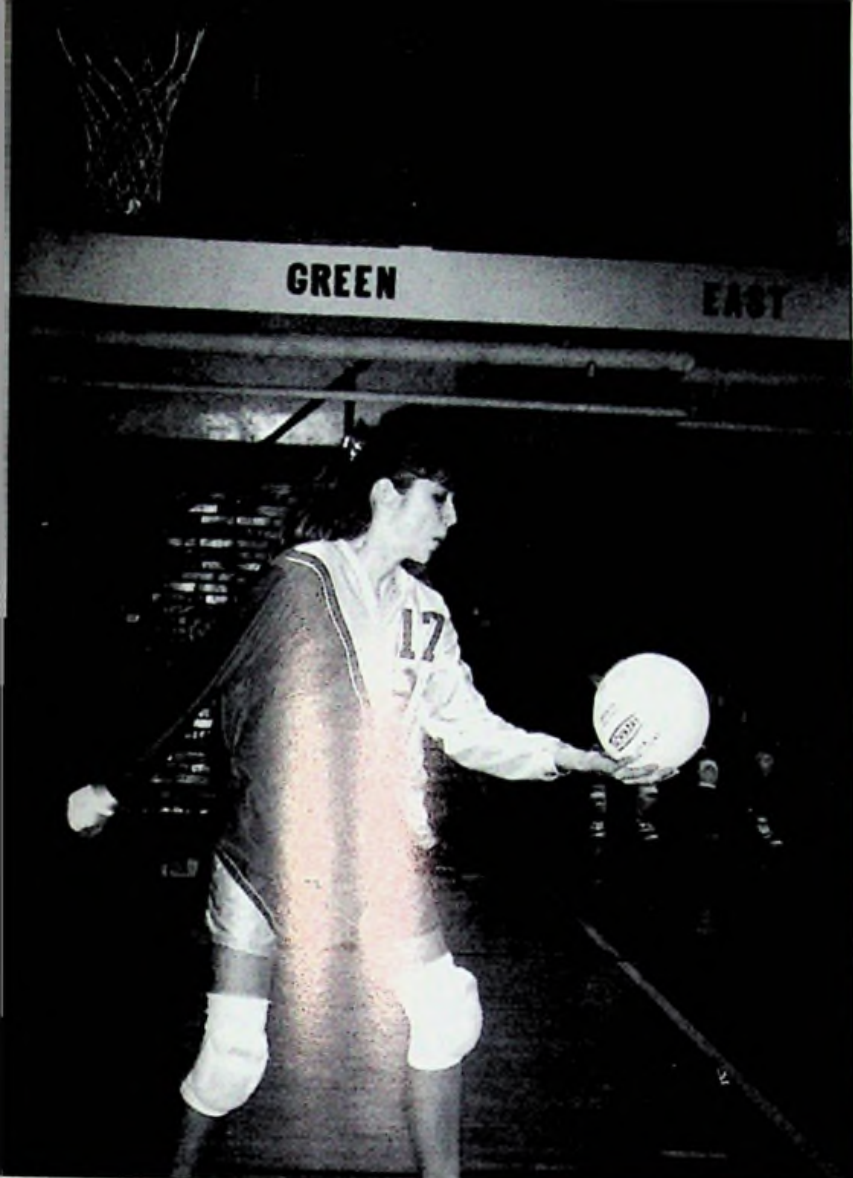

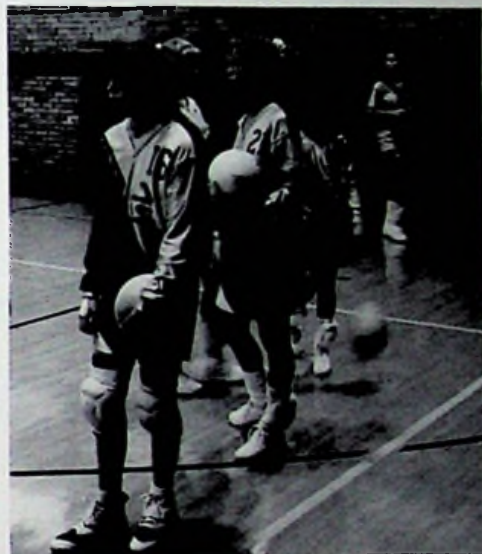

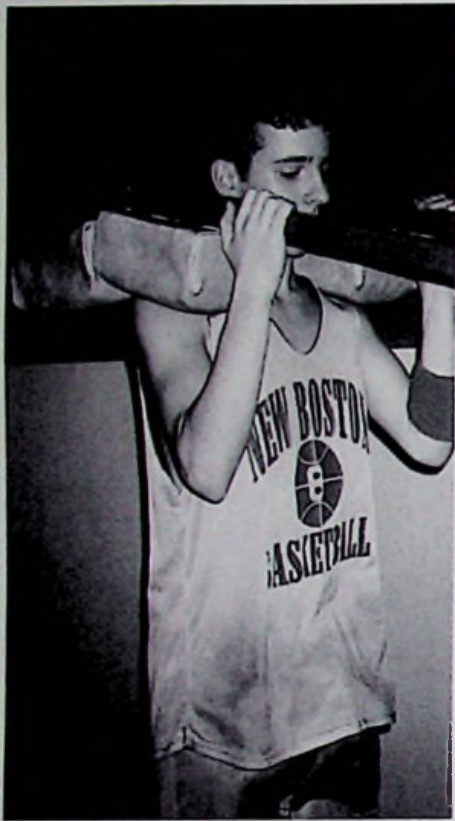

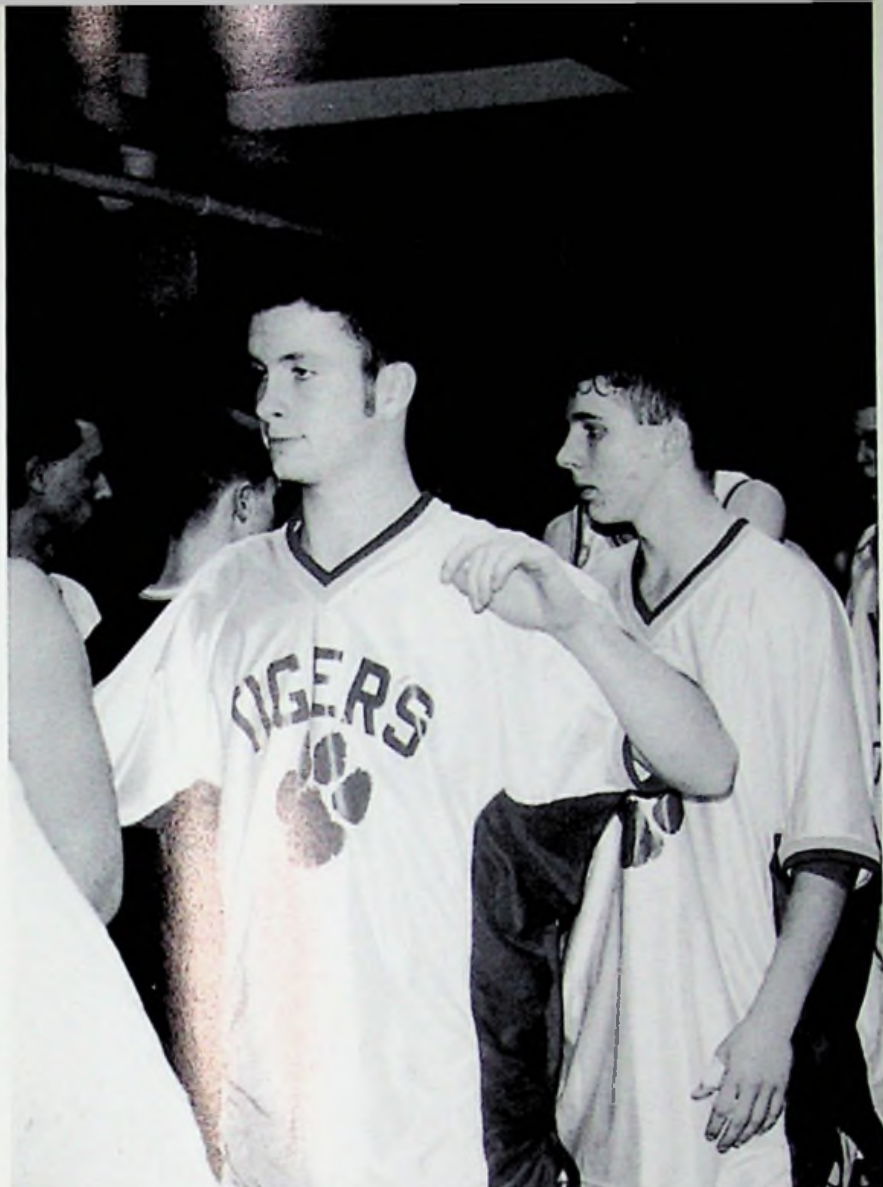

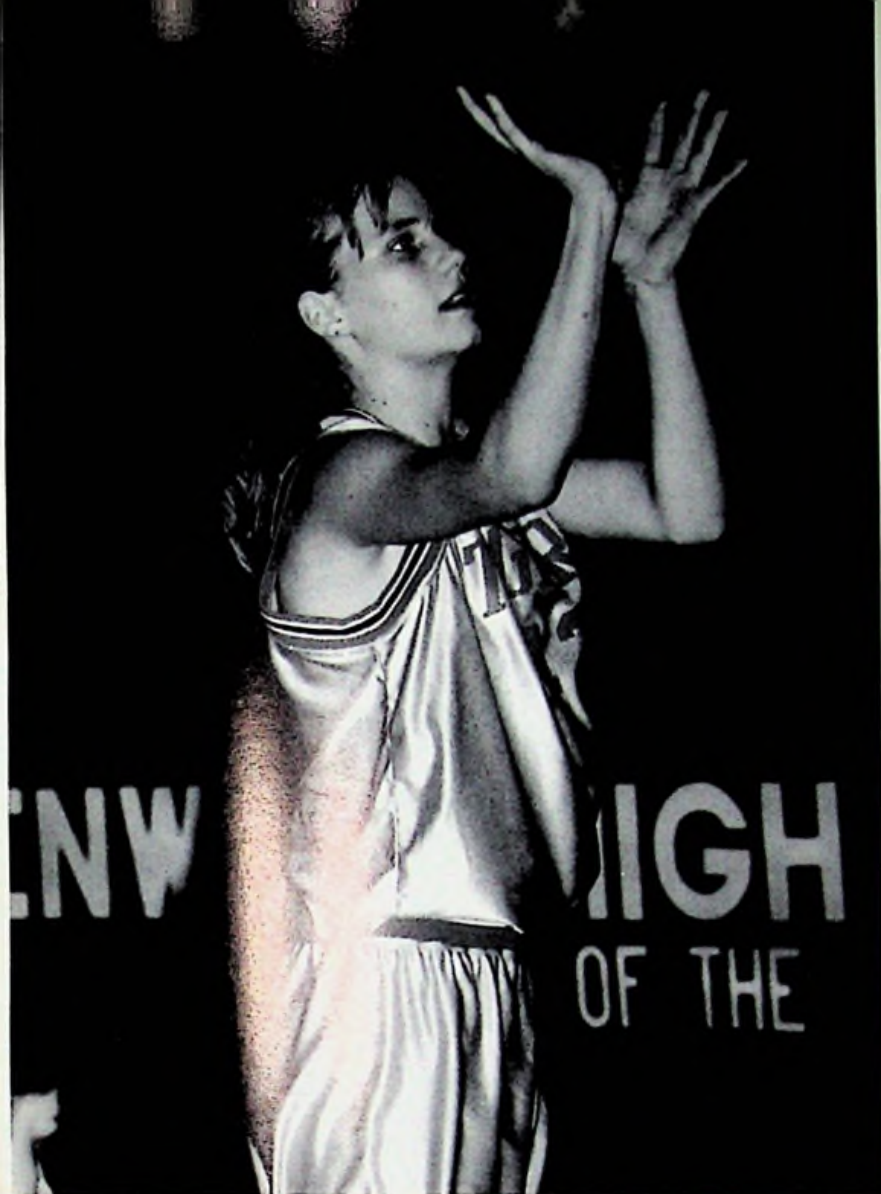

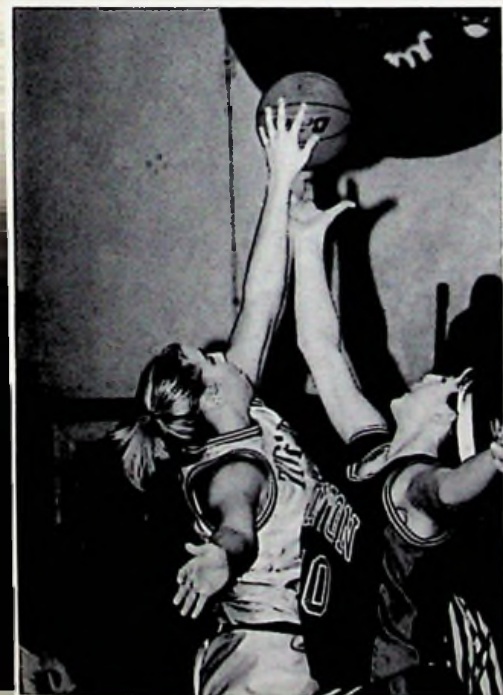

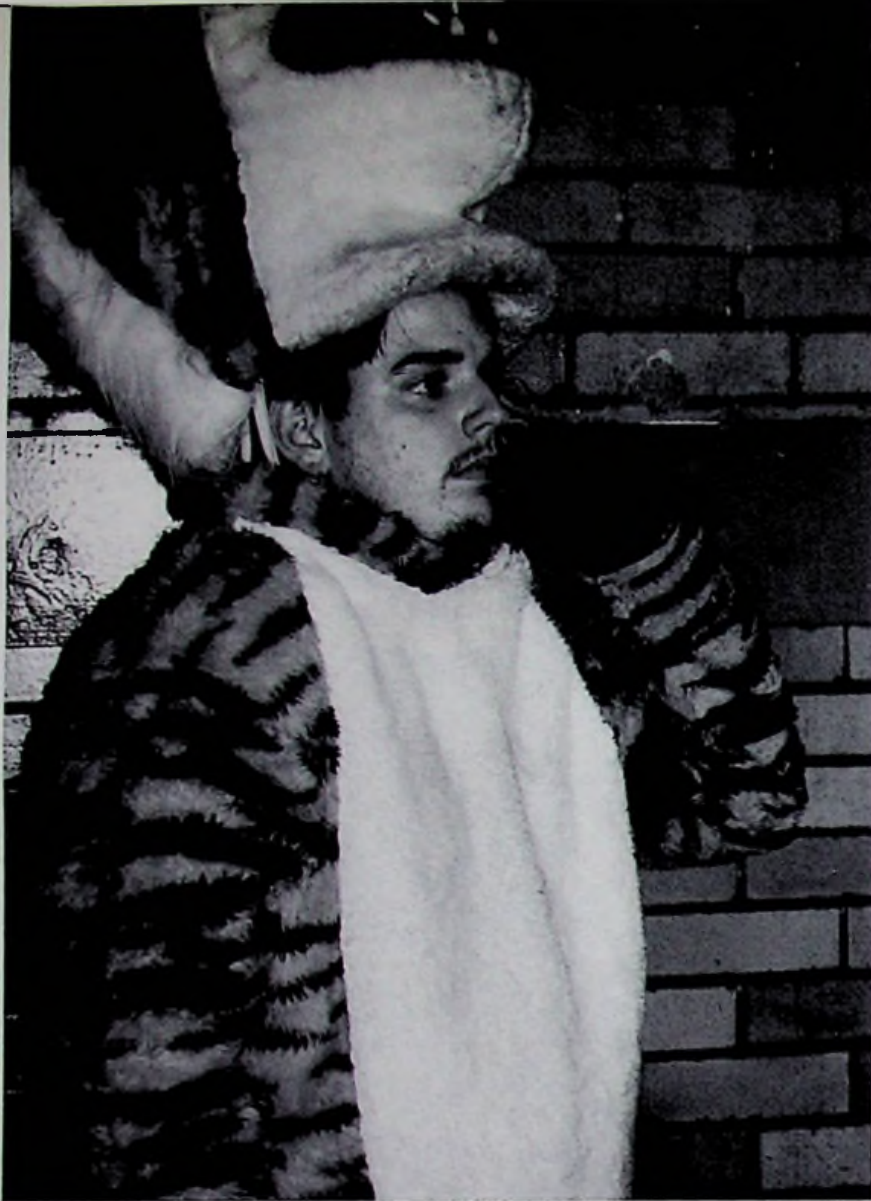

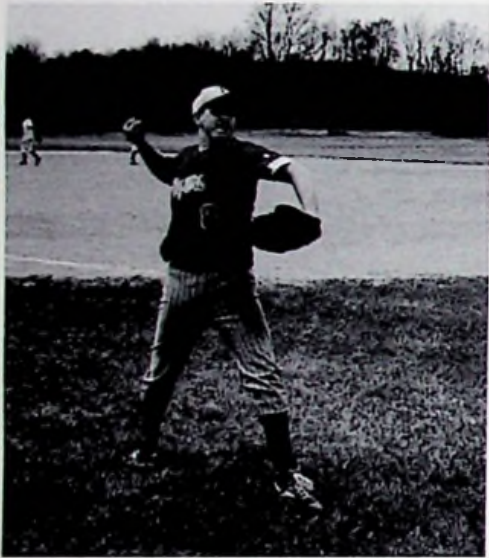

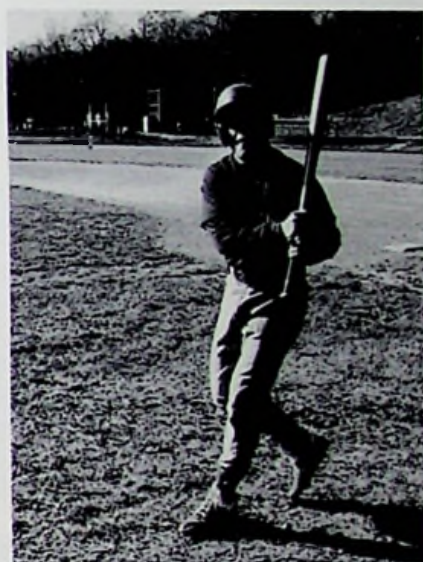
Tiger Baseball

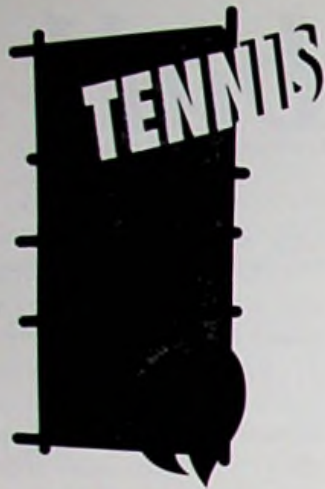

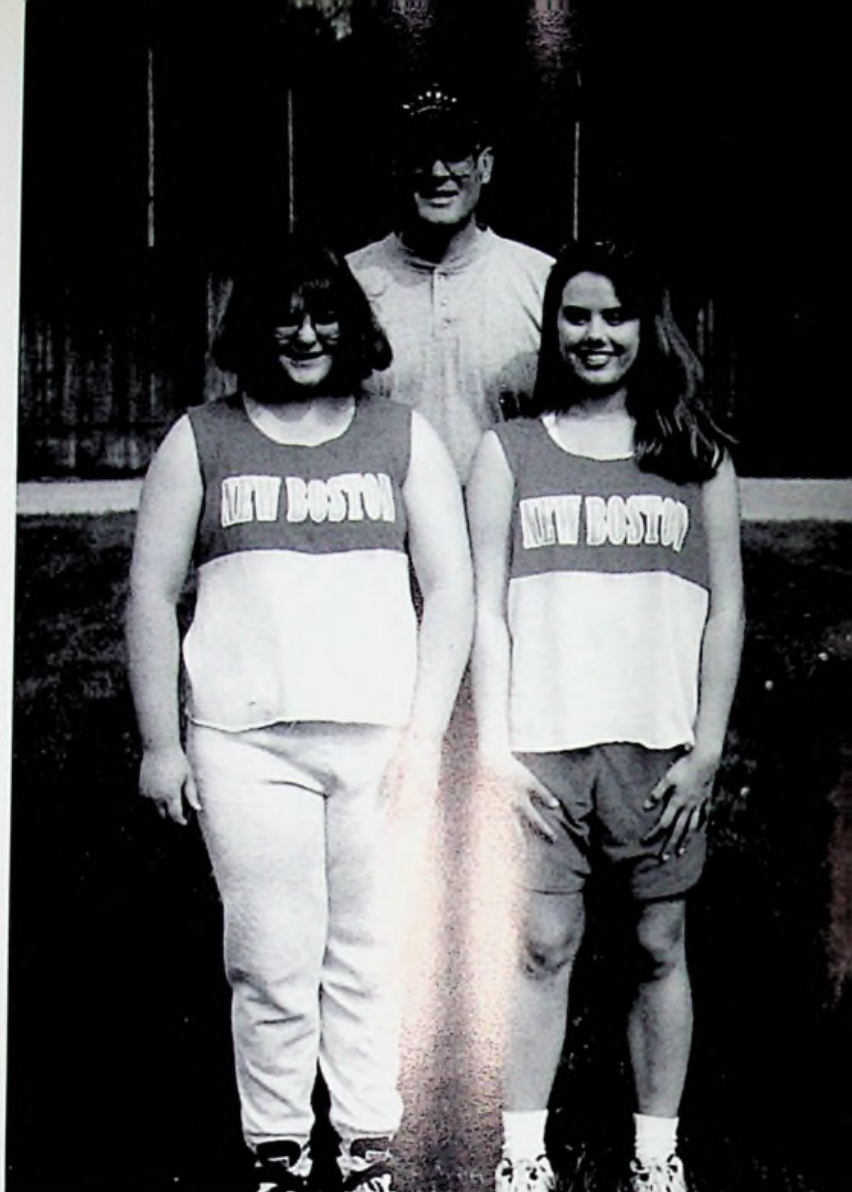

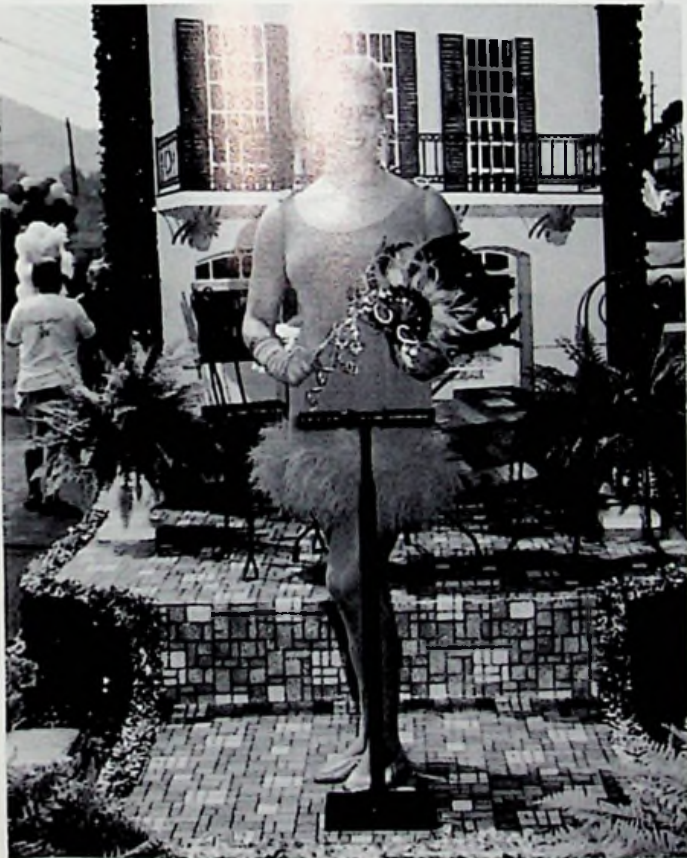
River Days

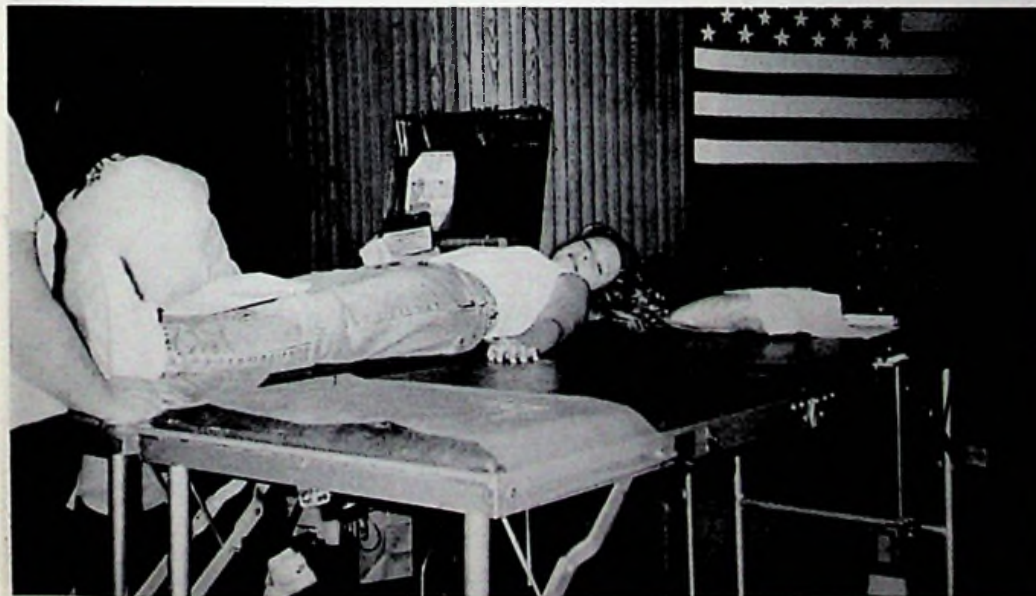

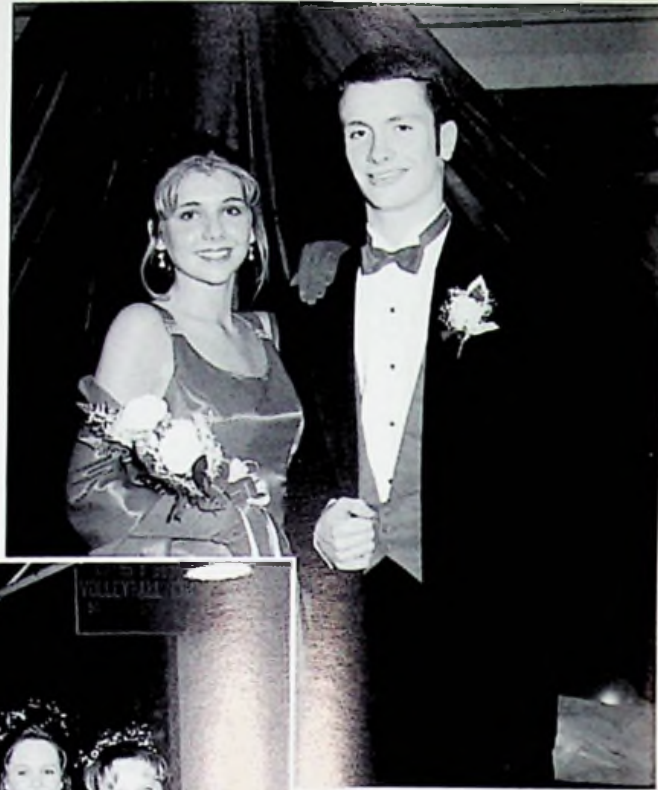

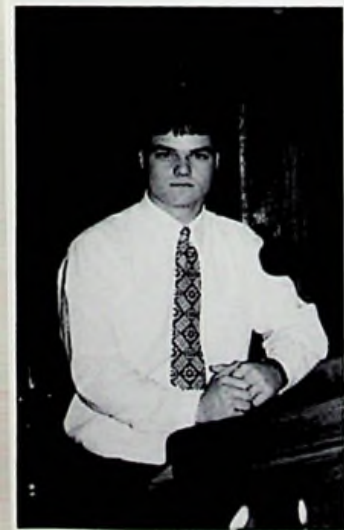
National Honor Society

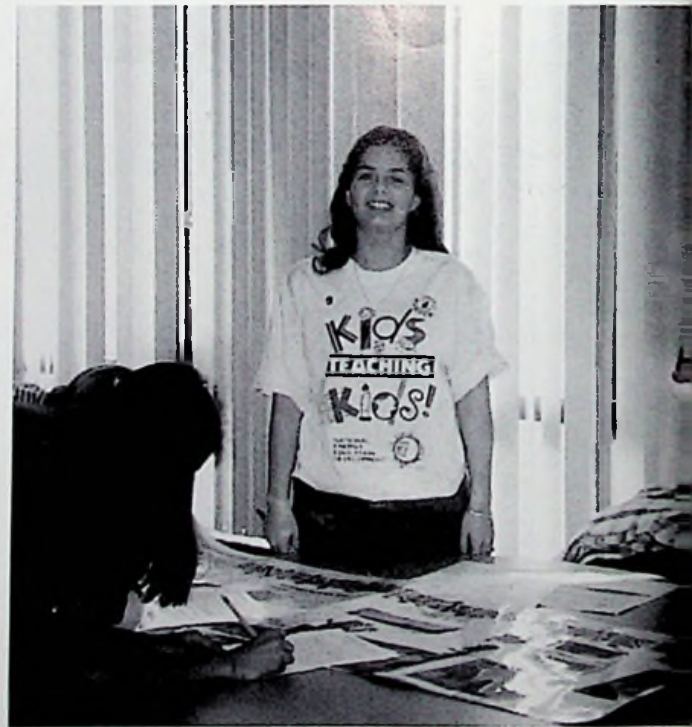

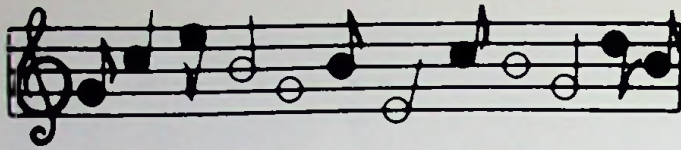

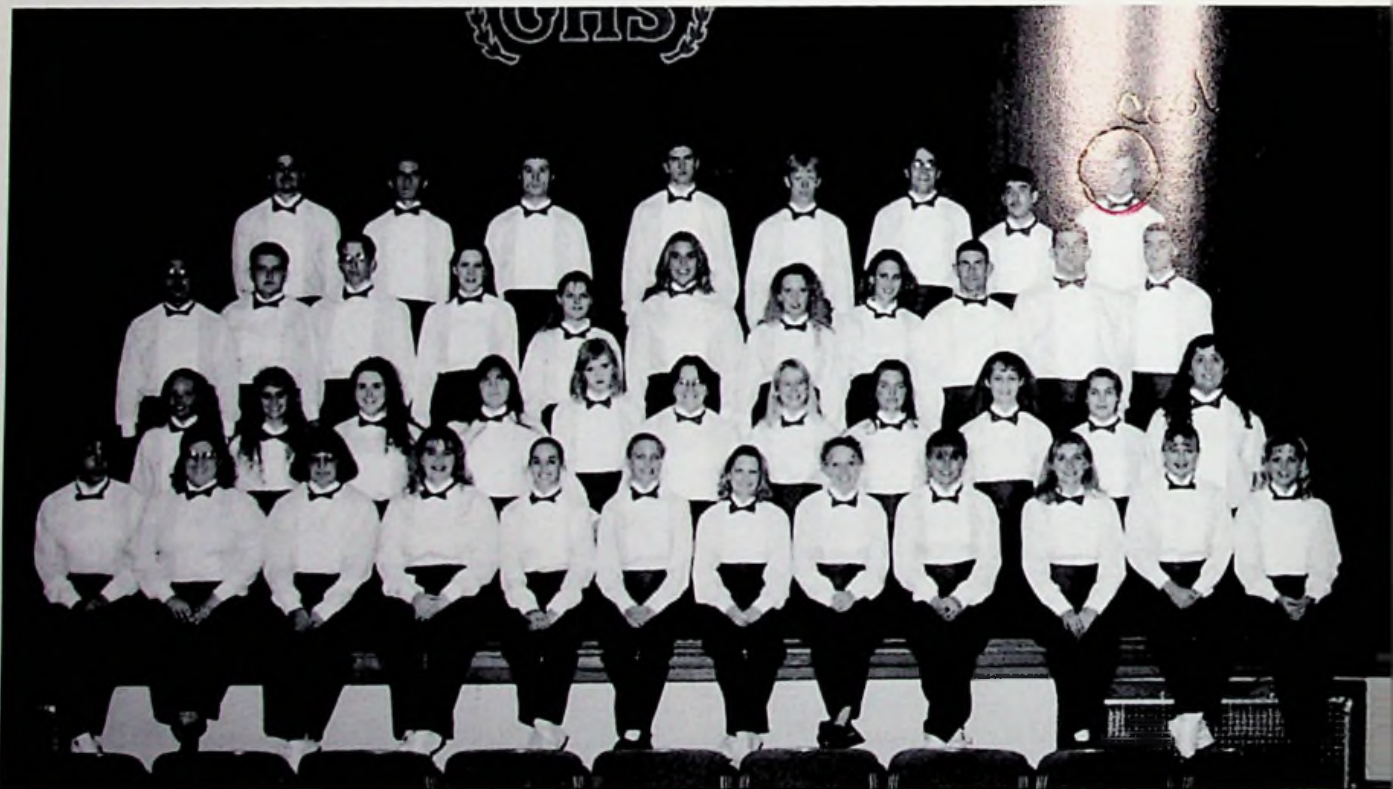


Chorus

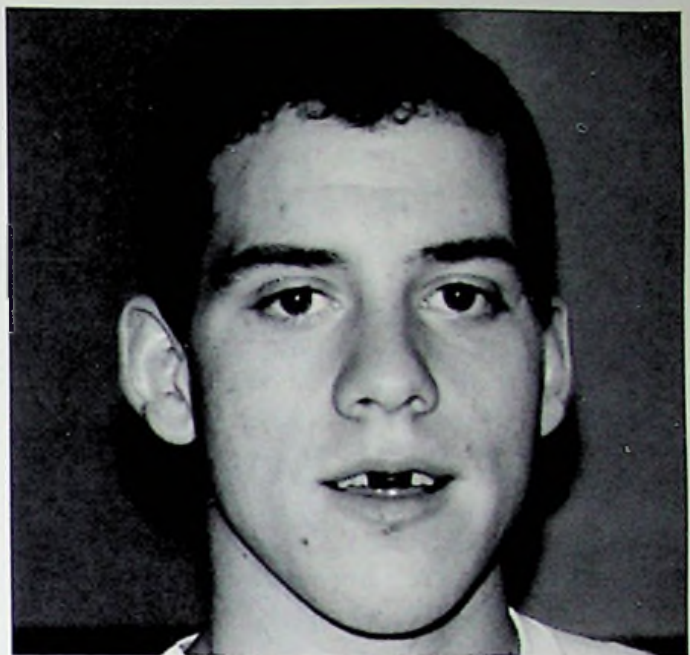

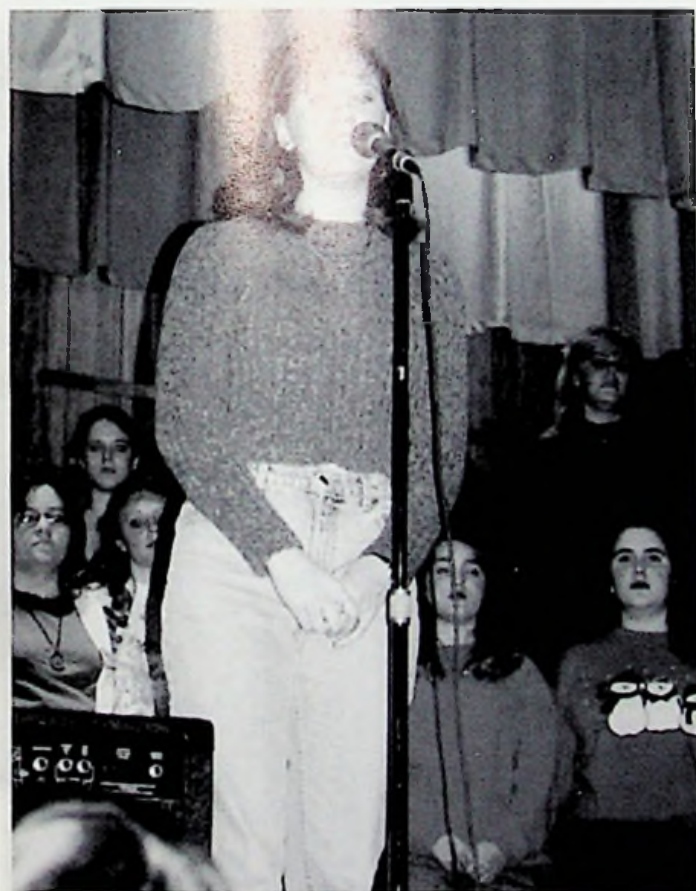

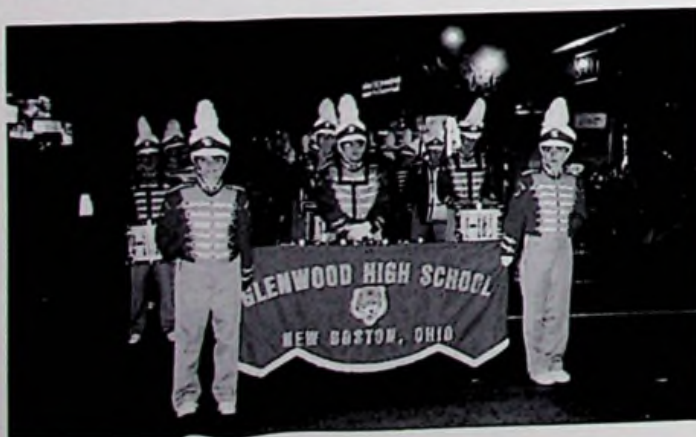

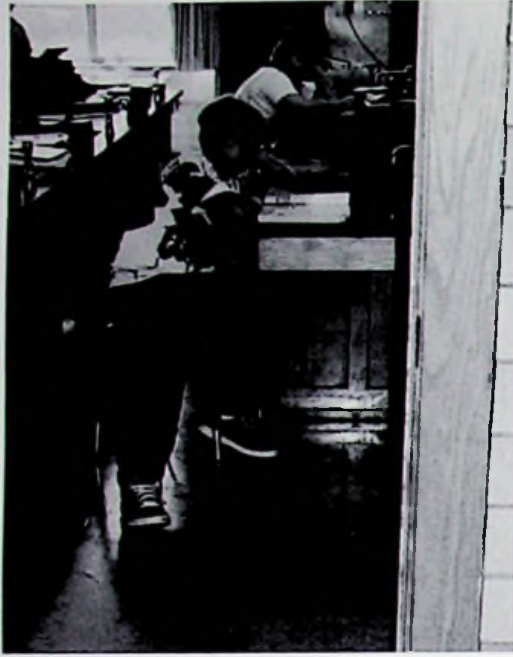

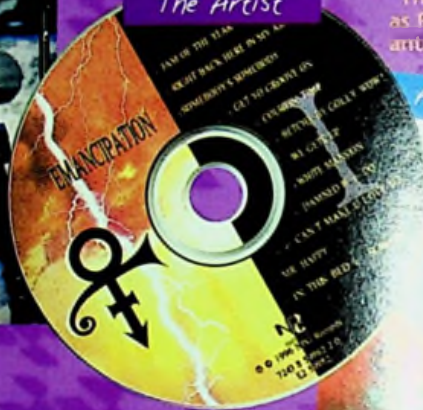
