The Trojans traveled to Ironton and dropped their first game of the year by 1 point. The Trojans fought to the end and gave the Tigers a real scare

Portsmouth took the opening kickoff and went 69 yards in 12 plays. The Trojans scored with $6: 36$ minutes left in the quarter on a 16 yard pass from Norm Burrows to Steve Barney on a perfectly executed post pattern play. The point after touchdown by P.H.S. failed.
P.H.S. punted three times for 86 yards and were penalized only once, 15 yards. The final score was $13-12$, the Tigers winning over Portsmouth.

## TROJANS BREAK 17 YR. OLD SCORING RECORD SCORE 41-6; TROJANS WIN

The mighty Trojans thundered over the gridiron Friday night. September 19 at home.

The 41 points represents the most points P.H.S. has scored in a single game since November, 1958, when the Trojans scored 58 points against Wellston.

Dan White had a 23 yard run, with Barney catching the ball for the extra point. Later Burrows passed to T. Pack on a roll out play and moved the ball to C.H.S. 37 yard line. Burrows then found R. Parsley open for a 37 yard touchdown toss. Burrows passed to Dan White for conversion points and P.H.S. led 14-0 with 1:06 left in the first half.

After halftime Tom Morris recovered a fumble and Pack capped a four play drive with an 8 yard touchdown run. With 1:07 left in the game, Tom Boden bootlegged around the left end for a touchdown scamper and Ted Sutton kicked the extra point.

Pack carried the ball 11 times for 102 yards, White had 89 yards on 12 carries; Parker had 44 yards on six carries and Parsley caught 2 passes for 57 yards. Pack was named offensive Player of the Week and Tom Morris defensive.

Boyd County played possession ball in the final minutes of the third and all of the fourth quarter by running 27 plays against only 7 by the Trojans.

Maybe it was the Homecoming spirit that got the boys up for the game, but whatever it was it proved effective in stomping over the Greenup County Musketeers Friday night at Spartan Municipal Stadium.

Greenup County made eleven first downs, ran 51 plays, and had 195 total yards, 133 yards which were from rushing. P.H.S. made 15 first downs, ran 49 plays from scrimmage and punted two for 58 yards total.
