






## Sensational Consational





The day of the prom, May 18th, finally arrived and the nervousness of the juniors and seniors filled the air as they thought of preparing for the special events that lay ahead of them.



#### The Teacher's Pet







#### Home Economics

The home economics classes, under the direction of Mrs. Sue Harrison and Mrs. Ann Sommers, prepare students for the multi-role society — family member, parent, and community member.

Students have an opportunity to select different courses. The family living course deals with individual growth concepts which lead to dating, engagement, marriage, and concerns of the married couple. This year the class engaged in two simulated wedding ceremonies.

In the child development course, students learn about pregnancy and the

growth and guidance of young children. The class had a session involving pre-school children.

These classes help teach students to prepare for the future so they can become useful members of society.














#### **Netters Take Serve**



The first game saw the TROJANS post a win against Chillicothe and from their they found themselves playing at St. John's Arena in the state playoffs.








