The home economics classes, under the direction of Mrs. Sue Harrison and Mrs. Ann Sommers, prepare students for the multi-role society - family member, parent, and community member.

Students have an opportunity to select different courses. The family living course deals with individual growth concepts which lead to dating, engagement, marriage, and concerns of the married couple. This year the class engaged in two simulated wedding ceremonies.

In the child development course, students learn about pregnancy and the
growth and guidance of young children. The class had a session involving pre-school children.

Other classes offered include the basic Home Economics I and II, advanced foods, which includes cooking foreign foods and using specialized equipment, and clothing management. Seniors may take the Singles Living I and II course which will provide them with the knowledge of living on their own and dealing with individual problems.
