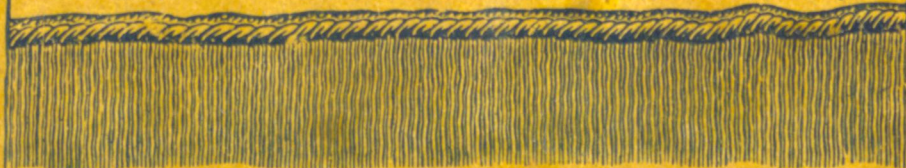

Wed. Dec. 5.  
A hard frost  
and a big frost  
that stayed on  
almost 9 half  
day. I hauled  
up Adley & Co.  
Smithy & Jim  
Whickup crew  
Lewie call &  
Tom Lewis was  
messed this  
after noon.  
The boys are  
out hunting

Thurs. Dec 6.  
A fine day.  
A freeze last  
night.  
All boys all  
worked at  
the corn all  
day.

At pulling  
at our school  
to night.  
They had a lively  
old time.

Fri. Dec 7.  
A damp cloudy  
day.  
Rained a little  
the church  
even all day.  
Johnnie Baker  
came up here  
to get an  
order for Jimmie  
his sister.  
I wish Jimmie  
had gone a  
hunting.

Sat. Dec 8  
A rainy like  
day. Spurred  
several times and

The shucked corn  
all day.  
I got ready and  
went over to  
the Chapel to  
church.  
Went home with  
Baker's father.

Sun Dec 8

I wanted to go  
home terribly but  
they went over to  
Alfred's Cauld

We had a right

Jan, Dec. 28

and came by  
I came by the  
bars.

Did not get  
home till dark.  
Dinner, Dr. Emory  
to Chas. Hunter  
was here.

I tell you I was  
glad to get here  
I believe I was  
very sick.

Jan, Dec. 25
