Class of 1943

With our country busily engaged in war and the conservation of articles vital to our nation's welfare being the keynote of the day, we the class of '43, were forced to break the tradition of banqueting the seniors. Realizing that this was to be the last year during the duration of the war in which a yearbook would be published, we decided to pool our resources and collaborate with the Seniors on this year's annual. In the following lines we briefly attempt to give the history of the class during our first three years in high school.

Entering high school in the fall of '39, our class was seventy-three in number. Our class officers were: Hazel Yeagle, President; Lucille Bennett, Vice President; Charlie Chapman, Secretary; Nettie Davis, Treasurer and our class advisors were Mr. Bennett and Mr. Butcher. We were well represented in extra-curricular activities participating in Glee Club, Band, Athletics, and in Scholarship, two of our members Lucille Bennett and Mable Blakeman ranking high in the county. Our social activities consisted of a party and a trip to Columbus, which brought our Freshman Year to a close.

Returning in the fall of 1940 our class had decreased in number to fifty-seven, with the big Study Hall as our Home Room and Miss

Wright and Mr. Pflieger as our advisors. We elected as our class officers: Junior Alexander, President; Raymond Campbell Vice President; Marilyn White, Secretary, and Nettie Davis, Treasurer.

Our social activities were few consisting of two weiner-roasts. In scholarship Doris Herrmann and Lucille Bennett represented the county in the District Scholarship Tests at Athens.

At the start of our third year our class numbered 43 and our class officers were: Richard Cooper, Arlie Williams, Marilyn White and Nettie Davis, with Mr. Hull as our advisor. We have been well represented in extra-curricular activities taking part in Band, Basketball, Baseball, and Scholarship.

In April we presented as our Class Play, a three-act comedy entitled "Seeing Double".

Our class, which started as Freshmen with seventy-three, has gradually decreased, until, at the present time, only thirty-nine members remain.

We sincerely hope as we enter our last year of school, that these thirty-nine members will be seated together on that eventful night in May of 1943, when we regretfully close our colorful high school careers.

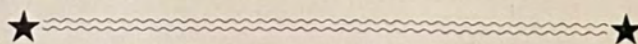

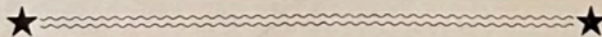

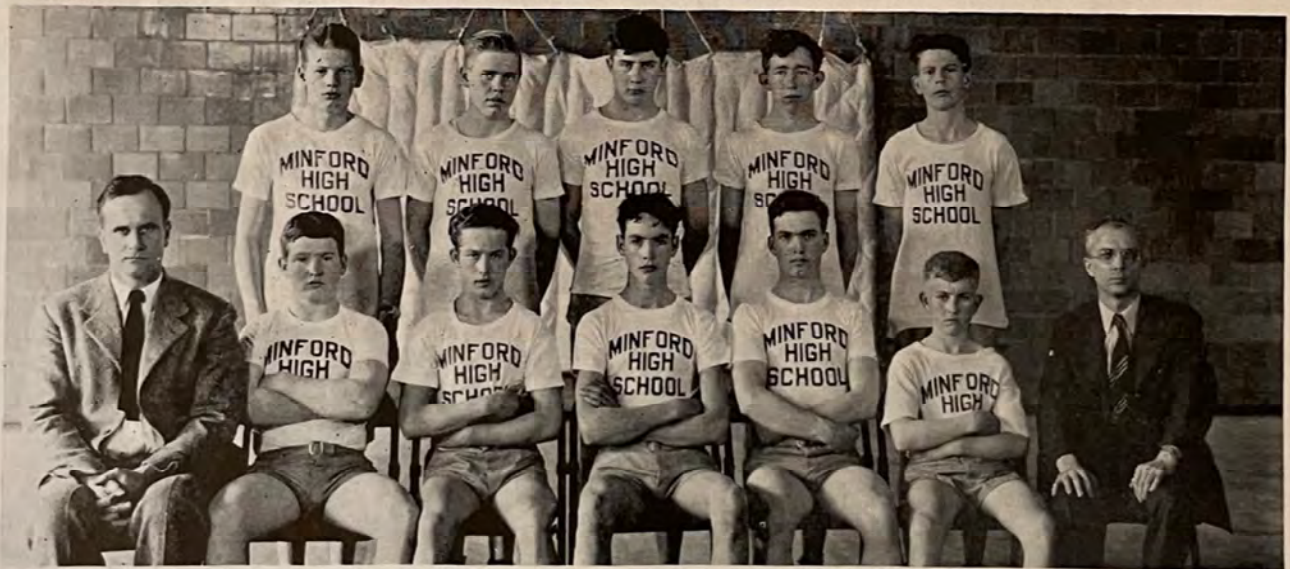
