## CLASS HISTORY

Sixty-nine frightened freshmen entered Glenwood High School on September 6, 1961. We elected Bonnie Grimm as our Queen attendant, and Bill Goddard and Cheri Beadle as our Annual King and Queen Representatives, Our class officers for the year were Cassandra Woods; President; Barbara Emnett, Vice-President; Janet Clifton, Secretary; Barbara Thomas, Treasurer; and Aaron Adams, Reporter. We were advised by Mr. Bond and Miss Bolton.

A group of sixty-three somewhat saner sophomores started the year on September 5, 1962. Cheri Beadle represented us at the Homecoming, and Jane Patton was chosen as Annual Queen; Mark Cornwell was our Annual King Representative. The following were our class officers: President, Roger Frazier; Vice-President, Aaron Adams; Secretary, Wendy Wohler; Treasurer, Roger McMeans; and Reporter, Linda Bolotta. Our advisers were Mr. Bond and Mr. Simpson. At the end of the year we ordered our class rings.

School started on September 4, 1963, with fifty-eight jolly juniors enrolled. Our Homecoming Attendant was Judy Huffman, and our candidates for the Annual King and Queen were Aaron Adams and Wendy Wohler. In October we received our coveted class rings. This was followed by our junior class play, "We're All Guilty", which was presented on November 22. With the help of our class officers: Paula Dunham as President, Roger Frazier as Vice President, Barbara Emnett as Secretary, Shirley Maynard as Treasurer, and Kay Riggs, Cheri Beadle, and Phyllis Fannin as Reporters, and our advisers: Mr. Bond and Mr. Simpson, we worked hatd to promote a Junior-Senior Prom that would not be forgotten. On May 21 our prom was presented as a troonlight cruise on the beautiful Ohio. The theme was "Moon River."

On September 9, 1964, fifty-eight now superior seniors arrived to complete their lasi gh s. ivol milestone. Shirley Maynard reigned as Homecoming Queen with Cheri Beadle as her Senior Attendan Th: Innual King and Queen of 1965 were Bill Goddard and Cheri Beadle. The presentation of "Room and ! ed" 3 our senior play was made on April 2. Our class officers were Linda Bolotta, President; Mark Cornwell, $\because:-\mathrm{Pr}$, dent, Kay Riggs, Secretary; Raymond Stidham, Treasurer; and Barbara Thomas, Reporter. We were again lvised by Mr. Bond and Mr. Simpson.

Our hard work paid off: at $4: 30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on April 20, thirty-five seniors and three chaperones boarded the bus for New York. We saw many memorable sights: the Statue of Liberty, the U. N. Building, Chinatown, the Empire State Building and the 1965 World's Fair, but most memorable of all was our fabulous hotel, the Knickerbocker, and the fantastic Peppermint Lounge. In Washington, D. C. we visited the Wax Museum, the Capitol, the White House, the Smithsonian Institute, and President Kennedy's grave. With some sadness and some gladness we started the trip home; we arrived at the high school at 5 a. m. Sunday morning, very tired and very sleepy, but with remembrances that would last us a life time.

On May 22 the junior class honored us with the prom, which was again held on the riverboat, the Chaperon. The beauty of the evening was expressed by the theme, "Some Enchanted Evening."

Our joy as we marched down the aisle,at Commencement was tinged with melancholy. For we realized that on that Tuesday night, May 25, 1965, we participated in our last activity as a student of Glenwood High School. Our dream which became a reality is now only a memory.
