# Our Very

The history of our area as far as the white settlers are concerned dates back to the discovery of the Ohio Valley by the French in 1749. A French expedition led by Celeron and Bonnacamps came down the Ohio River and landed on the west bank of the Scioto River, present site of the City of Portsmouth. The French visitors attempted to negotiate with the local Shawnee Indians but the Indians were closely allied with British traders in the area. This attempt at a French settlement failed. In 1763, this and the surrounding territory became a British possession.

Prior to this time, the history of the region was closely associated with the history of the Indians. The famous "Tremper Mound" from which a valuable collection of Indian relics was taken, is located three miles from Portsmouth, and within the city itself, there is an Indian mound in the shape of a horseshoe in Mound Park. In 1799, a Major Belli laid out the town site of Alexandria on the west bank of the Scioto. Four years later, Henry Massie founded the City of Portsmouth on the east bank of the Scioto. Soon, the citizens of Alexandria moved to the higher ground of the present City of Portsmouth. Portsmouth and Scioto County's early growth, as most areas on the Ohio, centered around river and canal transportation. The coming of the steamboat in 1810 and the completion of the canal in 1832 brought the town and population to more than 500 persons.

These early settlers were quick to take advantage of the natural resources of iron ore, coal, clay limestone and shale, and the way.

In 1853, the first railroad came into the area and within a few years to more than four thousand. In 1869, the city's population has steadily grown.

One of Portsmouth's major industries is the steel industry, located only 20 miles away, at Piketon, is one of the nation's newest atomic energy centers.

Other touchdowns were attributed to a 10 yard run by Dugan and a combination of runs by Dugan and White. The final score came late in the last period when Danny White ripped off a 55 yard touchdown run. White finished the game with 136 yards rushing.

### TROJAN MISTAKES PROVE COSTLY AS IRONTON GLIDES TO 23-0 WIN SEPTEMBER 14, 1973

Portsmouth came back in the fourth period to block a punt of their own. Phil Welbriht raced 40 yards after scooping up the ball and being aided by a host of Portsmouth blockers.

Linebacker Jerry Williams again played a superb defensive game. He was injured in the last seconds, but not seriously. Merb used all three quarterbacks-Lynd, Hehl, and Burrows.

Newark, ranked eighth in the State in class AAA, was the third top team the Trojans had faced in the new season.

The first Newark score came with 5:04 remaining in the first quarter when Echols ran in from 11 yards out. The scoring play followed a high punt snap by Portsmouth which gave the Wildcats possession on the Trojan six yard line.

Echols scored again on a 22-yard run, and in the third quarter on a 15-yard jaunt.

Johnson's first touchdown, a 10-yard run, came with 7:45 left in the third period and his second score, a five yard dash, occurred with 1:12 to go in that quarter.

Portsmouth picked up its only touchdown on a seven yard run by Scott Lynd at the 9:45 point in the fourth quarter.

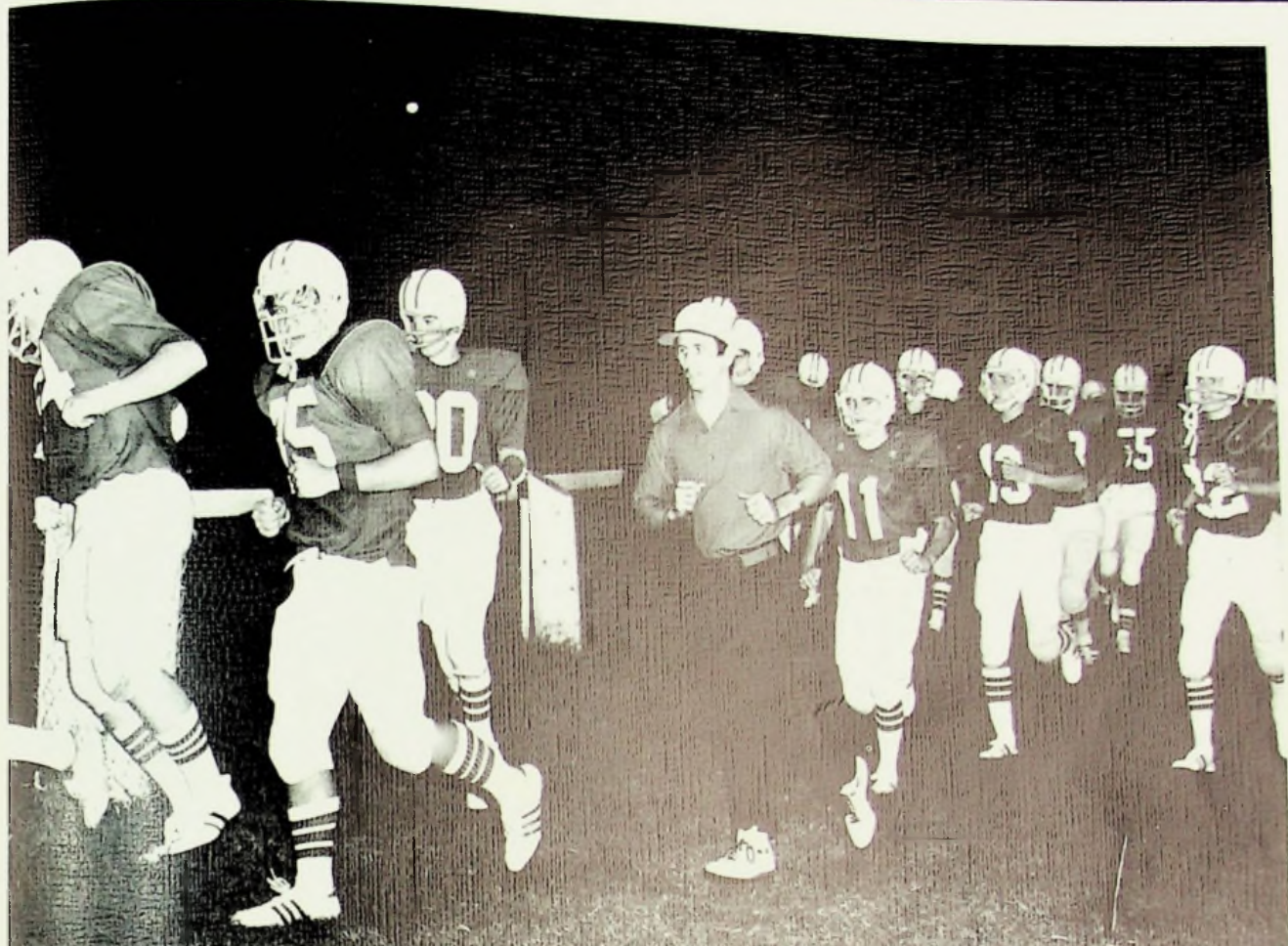

DANNY WHITE BREAKS OUTSIDE FOR A LONG GAIN.



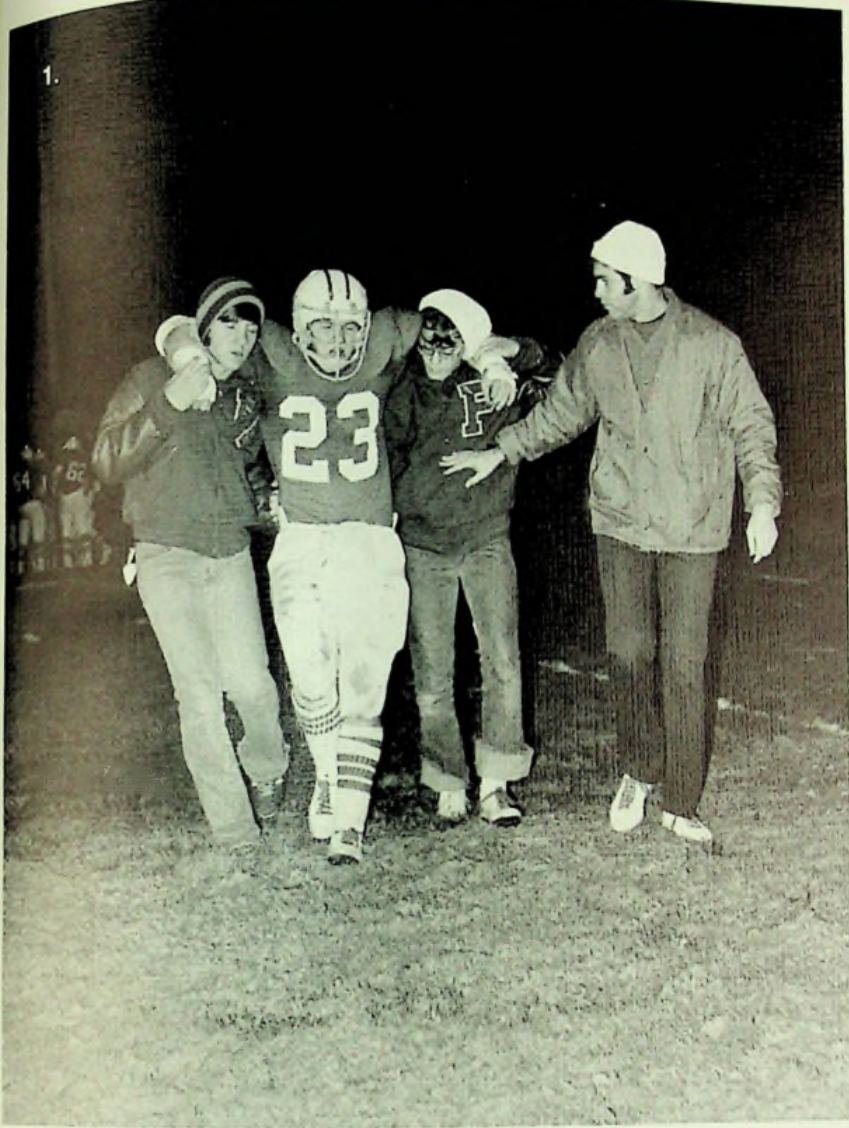

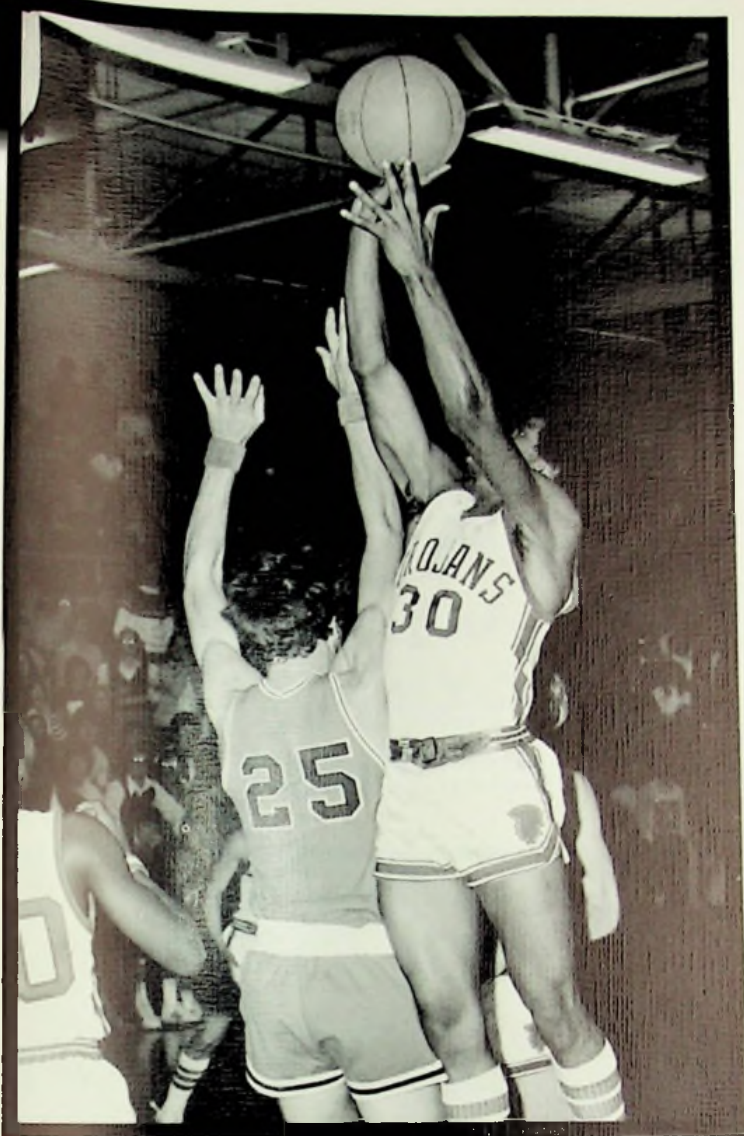

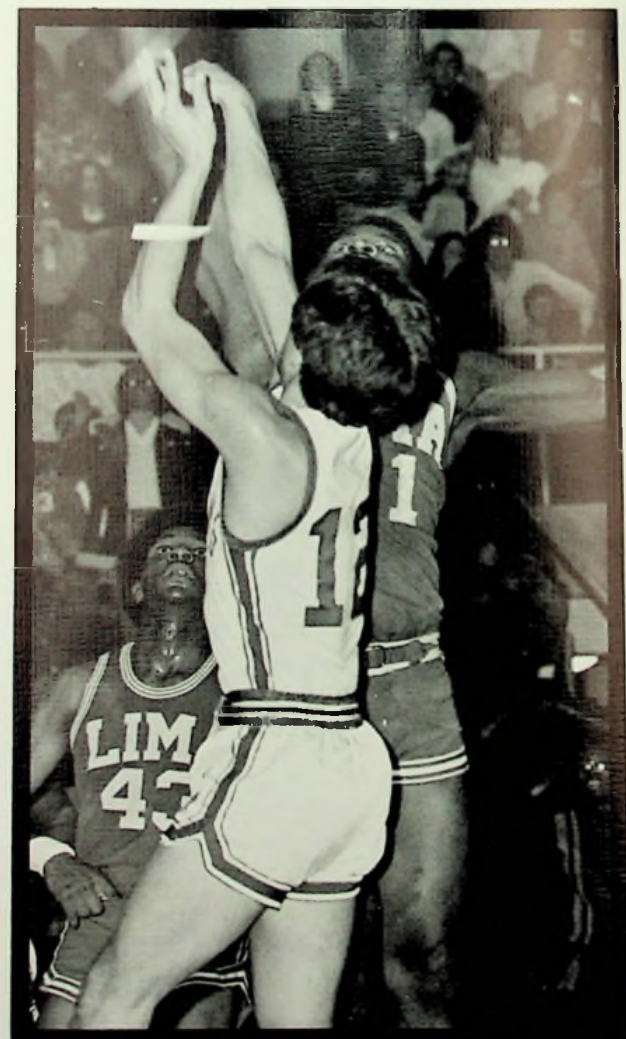
FEBRUARY 9, 1974

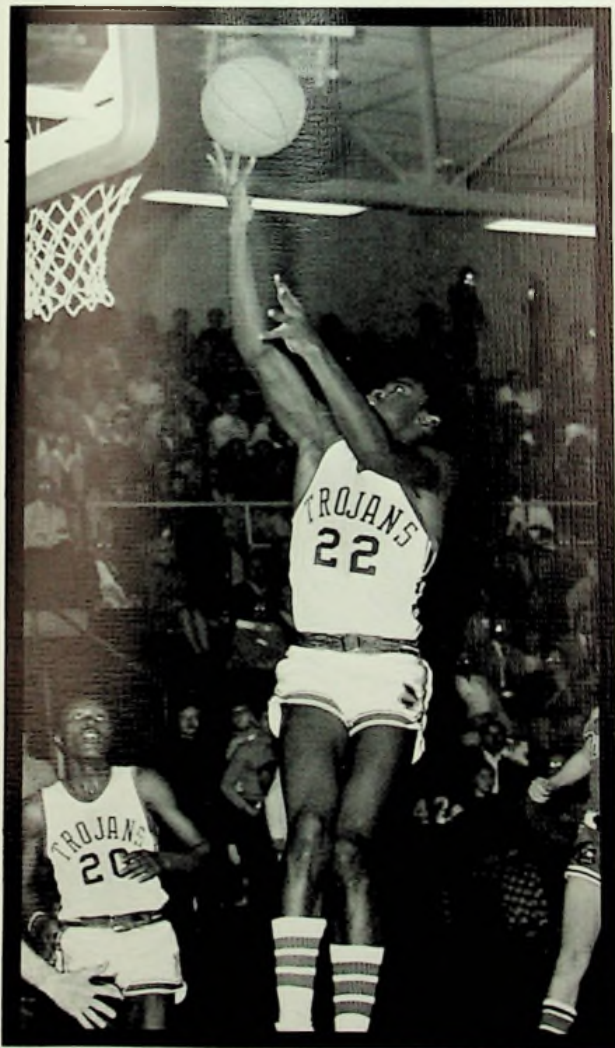

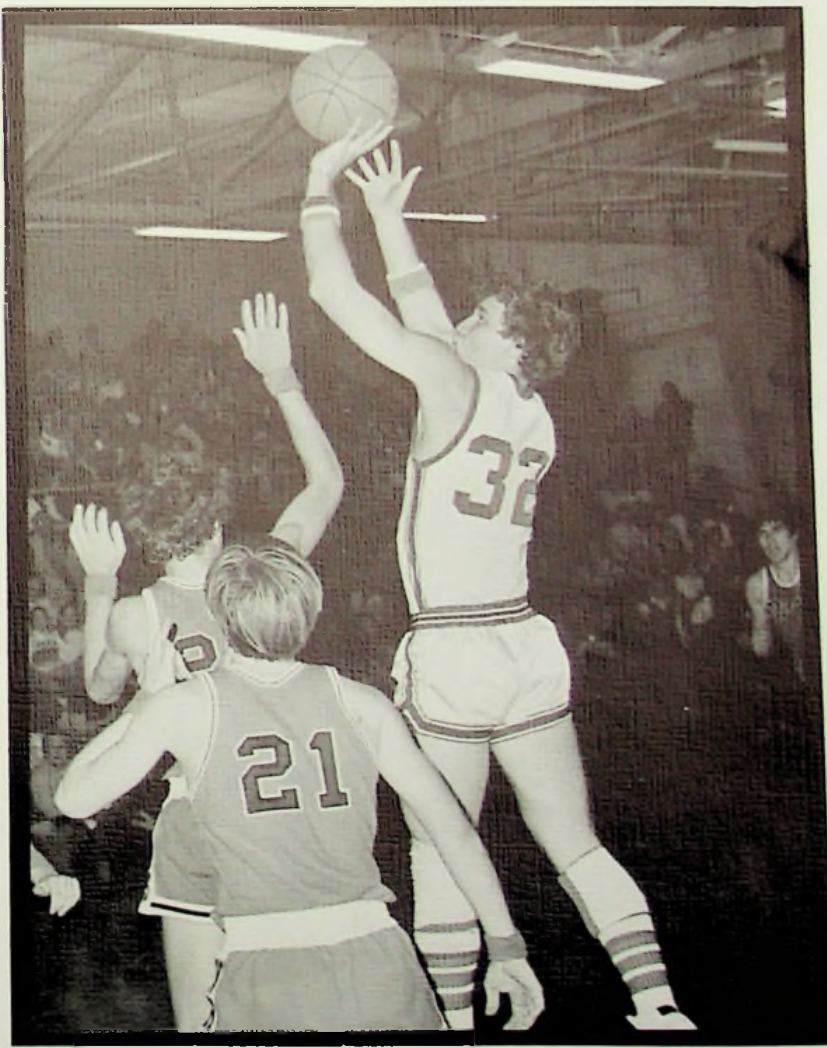
The Trojan tournament hopes came to an end as Portsmouth was defeated 74-63. The sectional tournament game was the Trojan's first after drawing a bye.

DAVE UNDERWOOD UP FOR A LAYUP.



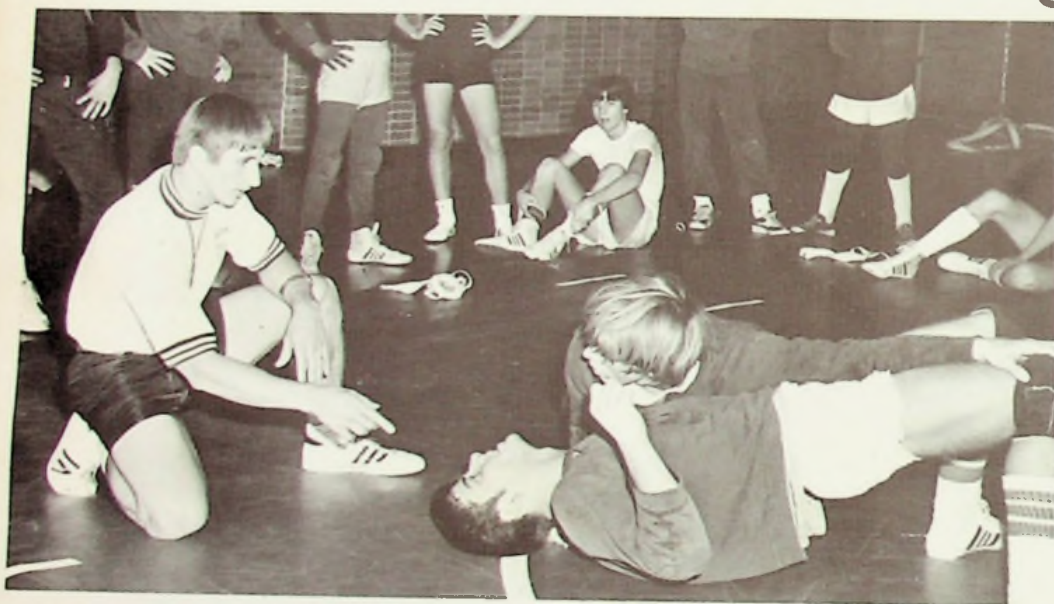
