

The history of our area as far as the white settlers are concerned dates back to the discovery of the Ohio Valley by the French in 1749. A French expedition led by Celeron and Bonnecamps came down the Ohio River and landed on the west bank of the Scioto River, present site of the City of Portsmouth. The French visitors attempted to negotiate with the local Shawnee Indians but the Indians were closely allied with British traders in the area. This attempt at a French settlement failed. In 1763, this and the surrounding territory became a British possession.

Prior to this time, the history of the region was closely associated with the history of the Indians. The famous "Tremper Mound" from which a valuable collection of Indian relics was taken, is located three miles from Portsmouth, and within the city itself, there is an Indian mound in the shape of a horseshoe in Mound Park. In 1799, a Major Belli laid out the town site of Alexandria on the west bank of the Scioto. Four years later, Henry Massie founded the City of Portsmouth on the east bank of the Scioto. Soon, the citizens of Alexandria moved to the higher ground of the present City of Portsmouth. 


